

The Third Joyful Mystery: The Nativity of our Lord



In this week's video, we enter into the third Joyful Mystery, the Nativity of our Lord... the birth of Jesus. In this mystery, like with most Christmas carols, we start in Bethlehem, which translates as the "house of bread." We know the story, but this week, we will look into this Mystery

Forced to leave their home in Nazareth, Joseph and his wife, the pregnant Virgin Mary, travel by donkey to meet the requirements of the Roman king's census. When they arrive in Bethlehem, they find that there are no rooms for them in the inn. The God of the universe, who humbled himself to become one with his creation, is born in a stable and is placed in a manger... a feeding trough for animals. The Bread of Life, born in the "house of bread," will become food for all. This is only one moment of many explored in this session to show how the stars truly aligned at the birth of the Savior of the world.

The Nativity of our Lord is an act of profound humility. God, abased himself with an infinite step down... a dizzying descent from God to slave. The All-powerful One made himself vulnerable by becoming an infant lying in a manger. But, Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, the wise men, the angels, the animals, and even the stars aligned in perfect harmony to adore the new born King on this silent night. Love incarnate is born and God now has a name and a face. His humble presence is the most powerful force in the world. We long for union with God, but to our great surprise, he longs for us even more. The transcendent God desires to draw close to us by becoming small! This is the mystery and the wonder of Christmas.


