

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week's first reading from the Book of Jonah teaches us about changing our hearts through penance. While Advent is over, doing penance is still a good way to grow spiritually and get closer to Christ, especially with Lent just around the corner.

Think about how we usually react to bad news, like hearing about wars, hunger, homelessness, or other tragedies. We might feel shocked or sad at first, but often, we just carry on with our day. Maybe we say a quick prayer, but that's usually it. While prayer is important, there's more we can do.

The story of Jonah is a good example. When Jonah warned Nineveh they'd be destroyed if they didn't repent, the people started fasting and wearing sackcloth to show they were sorry. They didn't just hear Jonah's warning; they did something about it. We should try to do the same. Instead of just saying "thoughts and prayers," we can choose to do some penance. This could be as simple as skipping dessert, not having an extra drink, or avoiding gossip. These small sacrifices help us reject sin and choose virtue. They also let us share a little in the suffering of others who are going through tough times.

Next time you hear about something sad or troubling, think about doing some kind of penance for those involved, along with praying and helping in practical ways. This not only helps them but also prepares us for Lent. God wants us to be caring, not indifferent. By doing small penances now, we can grow spiritually and get ready for the upcoming season of Lent.
