

Fourth Sunday of Lent





Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

Aloha ~ Wishing everyone a Happy Sunday and blessings of joy and happiness as we celebrate 'Rejoicing Sunday' this week. Big mahalo and God's blessings to everyone who came out for our Church and campus clean up this past Tuesday through Thursday. Everyone did a marvelous job making our church, classrooms, and campus so clean and beautiful. May God bless you and your family, and my special prayers and blessings to everyone. Let's con-

tinue to keep our church and campus this beautiful all the time!

As we enter the Fourth Sunday of Lent that is called *Lætare* (Rejoice) Sunday, from the first words of Sunday's liturgy. As on *Gaudete* Sunday in Advent, rose colored vestments may replace violet, and flowers may grace the altar, symbolizing the Church's joy in anticipation of the Resurrection of Our Lord. The central theme of the readings is that our salvation is the gift of a merciful God, given to us sinners through Jesus, His Son. The readings stress God's mercy and compassion and remind us of the great love, kindness, and grace extended to us in Christ.

The Gospel brings the great theme; Jesus, the Son of God, becomes the agent of God's salvation, not just for one sinful nation but for the sinfulness of the whole world. Through John 3:16, the Gospel teaches us that God has expressed His love, mercy, and compassion for us by giving His Only Son for our salvation. Nicodemus, the wealthy Pharisee, and member of the Sanhedrin, meets Jesus by night and begins a long religious discussion. Jesus explains to him that he must believe Jesus' words because Jesus is the Son of God. Then, by referring to the story of Moses and the bronze serpent (Nm 21:1-9), Jesus further explains God's plan of salvation. Just as God saved the victims of serpent bite from death through the bonze serpent, He is going to save mankind from its sins by permitting the crucifixion and death of His Son Jesus, because the love of God for mankind is that great.

Let us always love God and be filled with the spirit of rejoicing. Have a wonderful week. God bless you and your family.
